This week we will be working on drawing conclusions as we read the story *Turtle Bay* by Saviour Pirotta. It is about a Japanese boy who befriends a wise man and learns how to be patient and listen to nature. We will be working with proper and common nouns and the spelling words all have *sh*, *ch*, and *tch* in them.

Next week our story is a nonfiction selection about a wildlife photographer. We will work with drawing conclusions again as we look at the differences between realistic fiction and nonfiction. We are looking at singular and plural nouns and the spelling words all have the /s/ and /j/ sounds in them.

This week in math we are finishing the introduction to division and will have a unit test on Thursday and Friday. Next week we will begin unit 3 and will be working with patterns and estimating. We will also continue working on multiplication facts - keep working on the MATH LOGS!
